



INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL: ICELAND

PASSPORTS

If you are a U.S. citizen wishing to enter Iceland, you must present a **U.S. passport with at least six months validity** beyond your planned date of departure. Your passport must have two blank pages for a required entry stamp. In addition to carrying your passport, you should carry a photocopy of your passport, and leave a copy at home. Finally, a **Notarized Permission to Travel Form is required**. This form can be found on your trip website and must be turned in to your group leader prior to departure.

VISA

A tourist Visa is NOT required for a stay of less than 90 days for U.S. Citizens.

VACCINATIONS

There are no required vaccinations for travel to Iceland. Please check with your health care provider before making any health-related decisions regarding travel and visit the CDC link on your trip webpage for more details. MEDICATIONS

No medications are required for travel, but we highly recommend bringing all prescriptions and any over-the-counter medications needed such as medication for headaches, motion sickness, and diarrhea. Roads in Iceland can be windy. Please plan accordingly and pack motion sickness medication if needed.

CURRENCY

Iceland's currency is the Icelandic Krona. We suggest exchanging money (about \$100 USD) at the airport or through your bank. Major credit cards are also accepted in most places we will visit in Iceland, but may accrue a foreign transaction fee. Check with your credit card company or bank regarding fees. Please also alert your credit card company / bank about your travel beforehand or your card may be declined for fraud.

CONTACT WITH HOME

Depending on the provider, cell phones should have good service in most areas we travel to. Travelers should be aware of cellular data charges while abroad. Please contact your cell phone provider to inquire about rates and availability. The hotels we stay at will provide WIFI, and travelers should be able to access the internet while in Iceland.

ELECTRICITY

Voltage in Iceland is 230 volts with a frequency of 50 Hertz; power sockets are type F (prong and holes). We recommend bringing your own adapters and converters.

MEDICAL COVERAGE

Iceland has excellent health care facilities. The quality of medicine and service is very high. The school and parents will be notified immediately in case of a medical emergency. All travelers are covered by Grand Classroom's medical and dental insurance for the duration of the tour.
